



#### Classical Planist Scott Carrell coming to HSV January 21



TopWe are excited to be bringing back popular pianist Scott Carroll for the first Classics Series Concert of 2024. The concert will be on Sunday, January 21, 2024 at 3 pm at Presbyterian Kirk in the Plnes and will be followed by a meet and greet reception.

Mr Carrell enjoys a multi-faceted career as a pianist, collaborator and composer, having performed in the U.S.A., France, Germany, Italy and China. His virtuosic flair, expressive playing, informative comments, and innovative programming have garnered enthusiastic responses from audiences and presenters alike. His varied interests have resulted in several programs of French music, ragtime, and lesser-known works of the repertoire, resulting in residencies at Texarkana College, Northwest Missouri State University, and Guongdong University of Foreign Studies in Guangzhou, China.

Mr. Carrell received degrees from Southwestern University, the University of Illinois, and a D.M.A from the University of North Texas.

Mr. Carrell is an active member of the Arkansas State Music Teachers, he has presented sessions at both regional and state conferences, serves as President of the Music Teachers Association of Central Arkansas, and was recently named the ASMTA 2022 Teacher of the Year. He currently teaches piano, piano related courses, and music theory at Harding University in Searcy, Arkansas.

Pianist Haeshin Shin has appeared in solo recitals, competitions, chamber concerts, and festivals throughout the United States, Russia, UK, Luxembourg, Belgium, Spain, Ireland, Puerto Rico, China, and Korea. She has won prizes at American Protégé Concerto Competition, Bradshaw & Buono International Competition, Richmond Piano Competition, Samick Piano Competition, and International Competition for Pianists in Memory of Shande Ding. In recent seasons she has performed at Seoul Arts Center, Carnegie Hall, Harvard Musical Association, and Garth Newel Music Center. Her performance in the 75th anniversary of Leonard Bernstein Piano Recital at Tanglewood Lecture Series was broadcast on CTSB, the public channel in the Berkshires, MA. Ms. Shin holds a BM degree from Seoul National University (Cum Laude), and MM and DMA degrees from Boston University. During her study at Boston University, she received the Piano Department Award and College of Fine Arts Scholarship, and has been elected as a member of Pi Kappa Lambda, the national music honor society. She co-founded the Medtner Society of Korea in 2016, initially to introduce the music of Nikolai Medtner to audiences in South Korea, and currently serves as its Artistic Director. She joined the piano faculty at the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music in 2019, and continues to give online lessons to students from the Midwest to the Fast Coast after her move to Little

He has served as section cellist with the Ann Arbor Symphony, the Evansville Philharmonic, and the Owensboro Symphony. A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Wunsch began cello studies at age four. His teachers at university have included Eric Kim, Richard Aaron, Michel Strauss, Jan Ype Nota, and Roger Regter. He received his Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from Indiana University and the University of Michigan respectively. Through fellowship grants he has attended the Aspen Music Festival and School, the Colorado College Summer Music Festival, and the Garth Newel Music Center. He attended the Royal Conservatory in the Hague, The Netherlands for 3 years of additional graduate studies and cello studio leadership.



### Bus service available for Masterworks Concerts

The HS/HSV Symphony Guild is sponsoring transportation to the ASO Masterworks Sunday afternoon concerts in partnership with Arkansas Destinations. For the 2023-2024 season, the bus will be available for the six Masterworks concerts at the Robinson Center. Because the first concert was October 1, Masterworks season bus tickets are no longer available. Individual concert trips for the remaining concerts are \$45 round trip. The bus will depart the Good Samaritan Campus at 12:45 pm and will return all the passengers to the Village following the concert, arriving at Good Samaritan Campus about 6 pm.


